Bellasera Voice—

We are residents of Bellasera and have noticed an infestation of mosquitos this year.

Please be sure you are draining saucers of all flower pots or flower boxes in addition to making sure you are running your water feature and that it is chlorinated well and that it is not green water sitting stagnant where mosquitos thrive. Any buckets, wheel barrels or anything outside your home that holds water, even a small amount, is enough to breed mosquitos. Run your water feature, chlorinate it or drain it if it's not used. There has been a definite increase in mosquitos here in Bellasera this year due to neglected water features such as ponds, waterfalls, etc. Female mosquitos can lay up to 300 eggs at a time in stagnant water.

The West Nile virus comes from mosquitos. According to Mayo Clinic the virus can be severe to critical even cause death.

We hear neighbors complaining of getting bit by these mosquitos this year in Bellasera. Please do your part to keep them away. Please take action now. The problem is getting worse. Thank you.

Bellasera in the Rear View Mirror

A look back in Bellasera history that may bring back memories for long-time residents and be of interest to those not living in our community in prior years. Clips from past newsletters follow.

Bellasera Neighborhood News, November 2004, 10 years ago

- The board decided not to act on a proposal presented by Nextel communications to lease a portion of Bellasera's property for a wireless communications antenna and related equipment building.
- The Budget & Finance committee is considering a possible recommendation to the Board to establish a "transfer tax" that would impose a small fee (paid by either the seller or the buyer) on each sale of a house. The extra income could help to offset other expenses or be used to accumulate funds for future improvement projects.
- The Board of Directors at its Oct. 11 meeting appointed Patrick Quinn to complete the three-person ad hoc Governance committee. The committee is reviewing Bellasera's governing documents — the by-laws, CC&Rs and design guidelines — to recommend revisions for community ratification. The board also appointed Rick Tilton to the Budget and Finance Committee after accepting the resignation of Tom Rotherham from that committee. In other business, the board approved the purchase of a new phone system for the clubhouse and guard house and the hiring of a consultant to review and oversee bidding for clubhouse roofing repairs.

Bellasera Neighborhood News, November 2009, 5 years ago

- The long-awaited Scottsdale Appaloosa Library opens on Wednesday, November 4. It's located at 7377 E. Silverstone Drive, east of Scottsdale Road between Pinnacle Peak Road and Williams Road. That's in the old Rawhide property.
- From Bellasera resident Hal Schultz, news that Jordan Windows has closed, and all contact now is through Performance Windows and Doors, 480-558-5240. He recently had a window failure and needed repair. Service is available for the windows, that were installed in many Bellasera homes. There are no existing replacement parts for any of the framing of the windows or doors. Last December when the factory closed they apparently scrapped whatever was left. Performance Windows and Doors was formed by a previous employee. With Hal's failure, they were able to replace the insulated glass only.
- Last year our generous community sponsored a family of ten to help make their Christmas extra special. This was such a rewarding experience that we have chosen to do it again! We plan to adopt about 16 individuals this year. As soon as we know about their needs we will make an "Angel Tree." November in the Garden

It's Rest Time...For Your Garden!

November ushers in **milder temperatures**, **cool nights** and **short days** which lulls your garden into a much needed rest now through January. Plants actually move sugars and other energy, which has been manufactured all season by the leaves, into storage until needed next spring. Plants are no longer actively growing so fertilizer is not absorbed by the roots because of cool soils and inactive roots. So, save your fertilizer for spring!

I'll cover two major topics this month: (1) How to get your garden ready winter and (2) Planting opportunities that will brighten your garden.

Prepare for Winter

Water Efficiently

Plant requirements for moisture diminishes as weather cools and day length shortens. Reducing water helps plants go into dormancy, thereby preparing them to resist freezing temperatures, and also lessens the likelihood of root rot from too-wet soil. Adjust irrigation timers to run less frequently.

General Watering Guideline- Apply the same amount of water to soak through the entire root zone of a plant but not as frequently. In other words, reduce watering frequency, not time of watering. Some specific watering tips:

Herbs—Water established herbs once a week or less depending on the temperature.

Vegetables—Should be watered every three days.

Desert Adapted Plants (established)—Water every 14 to 30 days through December.

Cleanup

It's time to clean up the entire garden. Pull weeds and take out spent annuals and vegetables which can harbor insects and diseases during the winter season.

Avoid Frost Problems

Stop fertilizing cold-tender plants, such as bougainvillea, citrus, hibiscus, natal plum and roses. Feeding promotes fresh, tender growth, which is susceptible to frost damage.

Stockpile old sheets and blankets in a handy location to cover these cold-tender plants, along with flower and vegetable beds, if temperatures dip.

Planting

Bougainvillea-This is the best time of the year to plant Bougainvillea plants and, perhaps, replace any that didn't recover from last winter's frost.

If you do plant Bougainvillea, here are some guidelines to follow:

—Plant in well-drained soil and full to reflected sun (they will not bloom well in partial shade)

—Feed them lightly in the spring and summer after planting.

—Do not over fertilize them or they will not bloom.

—In early spring, prune the bush after danger of frost to remove dead branches and keep their height in check.

Vines—You can reduce intense reflected heat with vines as well as providing color. They can be grown easily here in Bellasera on walls with the help of a trellis. Some suggested low-water-use vines with pretty flowers include: Lilac vine, Primrose Jasmine, Queen's Wreath, Yucca vine.

Potato vine—This is another consideration which blooms on and off year-round, if temperatures don't drop below freezing.

Spring-blooming Bulbs- Plant in well-drained soil that is rich in organic matter. Mix a phosphorus fertilizer with soil in the bottom of the planting hole. Phosphorus, which promotes bloom, does not move readily through soil, so place it where the bulb's roots will be able to absorb it.

Herbs—Sow seeds for cilantro, dill, parsley, oregano and thyme. Transplant anise, caraway, chamomile, fennel, marjoram, mint, rosemary, sage and salad burnet.

Vegetables--Recommendations for this month include:

Seeds--Beets, Bok Choy, Broccoli, Cabbage, Chinese Cabbage, Carrots, Cauliflower, Chard, Collard Greens, Endive, Kale, Kohlrabi, Lettuce (Head & Leaf), Mustard, Onions (Bulb & Green), Peas, Radishes, Rutabagas, Spinach, Turnips

Transplants—Asparagus, Broccoli, Brussels Sprouts, Cabbage, Chinese Cabbage, Cauliflower, Chard, Kohlrabi, Lettuce (Head & Leaf)

Did You Know?

Anna's and **Costa's hummingbirds** are the most common hummingbirds at feeders now; both will breed in the winter. Some Costa's hummingbirds leave southern Arizona for the winter, returning in early spring to breed before the foreshadowing drought sets in. Although reptiles are mostly inactive in the winter, larger desert mammals such as bobcats and coyotes will remain active throughout the winter.
