Board Approves New Verizon Wireless Cell Tower Proposal

Bellasera held a Community Meeting on October 14 at 7:00 p.m. in the clubhouse to discuss and answer homeowners' questions and to respond to concerns regarding a new potential Verizon Cell Tower in Bellasera. Four of the five members of the Board were in attendance as well as a representative from Verizon Wireless. A drawing of the proposed location and a representative depiction of the new Cell Tower were displayed. For your review, the information is available via a direct link to our web site:

cell.azbellasera.org. The meeting lasted for approximately one hour.

At the Board's regular monthly meeting on October 22, the Board voted unanimously to approve the new Verizon Wireless proposal. The proposal is to install a single 26' faux cactus cell tower and small enclosure housing supporting electronic equipment in the Common Area adjacent to the 78th Street cul-de-sac in the Northeast corner of our community. In arriving at that decision, the Board determined and feels strongly the improved Verizon Wireless proposal is in the best interest of the Association and a majority of the homeowners, and will not have an adverse impact on the Association or the homeowners. Significant factors in the Board's decision were the receipt of annual rent in excess of \$18,000, the significant improvement in cellular coverage for our residents, and the minimal impact on the community.

A formal written notice describing the Board's action has been mailed to all homeowners in Bellasera. Our CC&Rs give homeowners the right to object to the Board's decision on this matter within thirty (30) days of the date of the Notice of the Board's action. Objections must be in writing and signed by a homeowner. If homeowners representing less than ten percent (10%) of all homes object in writing, the Board's decision shall be deemed approved by the community and the Board will proceed to implement the Verizon Wireless proposal. No action on your part is required if you are in favor of the Board's decision.

From the Clubhouse Office

Please be aware that Four Peaks Landscape felt it best not to over-seed the dog park this fall in order to give the Bermuda grass time to strengthen and fill in the gaps in the grass. The grass will turn brown during the winter but it is not dead, it will revive in the spring.

We look forward to a more healthy turf in the dog park for the spring.

A further explanation regarding the palm trees. There are four kinds of palms that are approved for use in Bellasera and they are considered an accent plant: Mediterranean Fan Palm, Sago Palm, Mexican Sago and the Pygmy Date Palm.

We hope this gives you a better understanding of what is permissible and approved by your Design Guidelines.

This is a reminder that if you want to make any changes to the outside of your home or to your yard, a Modification Application (Architectural Application) is required for approval by the Modification Committee. The Application may be found on our Bellasera website, azbellasera.org, click or touch "Forms", or you may call the office, **480-488-0400**, to obtain one.

If you want to make a paint change, please check with the office for the paint scheme that is permitted. Homes that are side by side may not have the same color scheme. A Modification Application is required for a paint change also.

Please submit the application to **Sharon** in the Bellasera office to ensure the application gets to the committee.

With the holidays fast approaching, we want to remind everyone to check your house alarms and secure your doors and windows against potential break-ins. Also if you are expecting a package please ensure you will be at home to receive it or have a neighbor receive it for you and to not leave anything out that would indicate that you are not at home. As a reminder, we do not accept packages at the on-site office or allow the gate attendants to accept packages.

If you see anything suspicious please call the police non-emergency number, **480-391-5000**, immediately and they will investigate quickly. There has already been one attempted break-in, that we are aware of; we want everyone to be aware and on the look out to protect yourselves and your neighbors.

November in the Garden

November- Full of Changes and Plenty to Like!

November is one of my favorite months here in the Bellasera as it begins the transition to winter providing us with an opportunity to truly enjoy and appreciate our surroundings. In addition to all of the obvious seasonal changes we undergo, it is also an uplifting month full of positive happenings such as: **Thanksgiving, Outdoor Dining, Pumpkins** and, if you're into sports, **College and Pro Football** kick into high gear.

The above has nothing to do with your garden but the remaining items on my list apply to both you and your garden: **moderate temperatures, cool nights** and **short days**.

After suffering through a long summer, we certainly welcome these changes as does your garden. These conditions will invigorate us and, at the same time, lull your plants into a much needed rest now through January which will result in major changes as well as necessitate making adjustments in how to care for your garden.

Will Your Garden have Color This Winter?

Although winter conditions will put your gardens to rest through January, you can continue to plant frost-hardy and native woody shrubs and include items that will brighten your garden for the winter and spring. Things might not look bad yet. However, once the temperatures drop, most plants will be closing down and going dormant for the winter. If you'd like to add some color that blooms in the fall and winter and liven up your yard for the holidays, you can do it with the right plants. Here are some good shrub options.

Barberry – This shrub is evergreen and has yellow flowers that bloom from late winter to spring. It makes a good informal hedge and attracts birds.

Weeping Dalea – This shrub that has a spreading shape and is evergreen. It has purple clusters of flowers that bloom from the fall to the spring.

Red Erempholia – Rounded evergreen shrub with red tubular flowers that bloom from late winter to spring. This plant attracts hummingbirds.

Chuparosa – Sprawling plant that is semi-evergreen with orange to red tubular flowers that bloom from late winter to spring. It attracts hummingbirds too.

Red Justicia – Sprawling evergreen shrub. It has bright red flowers that bloom from the fall to the spring. It can be used in containers.

Green Feathery Senna – Round and airy shrub with yellow clusters of flowers that bloom from late winter to spring.

These shrubs can add winter color to your yard and make it more inviting.

Bulbine – It forms small clumps to 18 inches tall by 2 to 3 feet across with fleshy bright-green leaves that look good all year around. Its flowers are a tall spike of small yellow blossoms.

Indigo Bush- This evergreen shrub has an open, rounded growth form to 5 feet tall and wide. Its delicate silver foliage provides a striking contrast to the masses of violet flowers produced in winter and early spring. Indigo bush is quite susceptible to over watering, so plant it in well-drained soil and be careful to not kill it with kindness. The nectar-rich blossoms attract bees and butterflies.

Black Dalea - This shrub blooms in late fall with masses of bright purple flowers. It is evergreen and forms a rounded mound of gray-green foliage to 4 feet tall by 5 feet wide. As with Indigo bush, it needs full sun and is very tolerant of reflected heat. The bees cover this shrub during the bloom season.

Emu Bush - Blooming on this shrub begins in January and is in full swing by Valentine's Day. The masses of tubular red flowers are truly spectacular. For the rest of the year, this evergreen shrub provides nice deep green foliage and a dense rounded form. Plant in full sun and allow it plenty of room as it can quickly grow to 4 feet tall by 5 feet wide. It is cold hardy to the mid-20s.

Angelita Daisy - This is one of the best perennials to plant for year-round color. Although blooming slows down in winter months, it can still be counted on to provide a splash of sunny yellow in the garden, with its slender bright-green leaves.

Santa Rita Prickley Pear- This is the cactus with the rich purple pads the provide lots of winter color. It has a yellow bloom that appears in late spring.

You should be able to find a good portion of these at our local nurseries.

Water Efficiently

Plant requirements for moisture diminishes as weather cools and day length shortens. Reducing water helps plants go into dormancy, thereby preparing them to resist freezing temperatures, and also lessens the likelihood of root rot from too-wet soil. Adjust irrigation timers to run less frequently.

General Watering Guideline- Apply the same amount of water to soak through the entire root zone of a plant but not as frequently. In other words, reduce watering frequency, not time of watering. Some specific watering tips:

Herbs- Water established herbs once a week or less depending on the temperature.

Vegetables- Should be watered every three days.

Desert Adapted Plants (established) - Water every 14 to 30 days through December.

Miscellaneous

Stop Feeding- Do not fertilize roses or tropical landscape plants (i.e., bougainvillea, hibiscus), as fertilizer encourages tender new growth that is prone to frost damage.

Weed Control- Pre-emergent herbicides can be applied from October through early December for winter annual weed control. Follow the package directions carefully for best results. DO NOT use pre-emergent herbicides where you will be planting seeds this season.

Cleanup- It's time to clean up the entire garden. Pull weeds and take out spent annuals and vegetables which can harbor insects and diseases during the winter season.

Did You Know

Keep your garden tools clean and sharp. To avoid spreading plant diseases via your tools, follow these steps:

- Hose soil off of garden tools before moving to another area of the landscape.
- Sterilize pruning tools after each and every cut if there is any chance the plant is infected with a disease.
- Keep your tools sharpened. Sharp tools make for clean wounds which heal quickly. Take care of your tools, they will last longer and so will you and your plants!

Plant of The Month..... Bougainvillea

Bougainvilleas are evergreen desert woody vines that flower several times throughout the year. They are certainly well represented in Bellasera and can produce beautiful colors. The bougainvillea would like a little shade during the day, but it will be fine in full sun.

Bougainvillea plants can be trained into various shapes. They can be used as vines, shaped into bushes, into ground cover, or just let to grow wild.

The actual flower of the plant is small and generally white, but each cluster of three flowers is surrounded by three or six bracts with the bright colors associated with the plant, including pink, magenta, purple, red, orange, white, or yellow. It is sometimes referred to as "paper flower" because the bracts are thin and papery. The fruit is a narrow five-lobed achene.

They are very frost sensitive but, even if the bougainvillea plant dies in the frost, it almost always comes back after the winter if it is pruned. My experience is that covering them during a frost is a waste of time.

Unless you have a lot of space to let it grow wild, bougainvillea will need periodic trimming. Don't be afraid to cut it way back.

Be careful when pruning your bougainvillea plants -- they have thorns and they aren't easy to handle! One last thing about bougainvillea: they are dirty. That means that you'll have red bracts (those are the leaves that turn red that make it so pretty) everywhere. Don't put a bougainvillea next to a pool unless you are prepared for constant cleaning.
