# Clubhouse Corner

#### **Security Service Update**

In October your Board of Directors voted to replace our prior front gate security service with a new local, family-owned vendor - Anderson Security Agency. Information regarding Anderson is included on page 6.

The transition to our new security service provider has generally gone smoothly and community feedback has been mostly positive. There have been some minor glitches to be expected when a new vendor takes over and becomes familiar with our systems and practices. It is an ongoing process.

To further improve security service performance and enhance community security we respectfully request that our homeowners/residents make full use of the QuickPass online visitor management service. Directions to create an account and to sign on and utilize the QuickPass service are on page 6. While this service has been available for several years, many residents continue to phone the front gate guard to request the guard add expected visitors to their account. This places an unnecessary burden on the guard and takes his/her attention away from their other responsibilities.

In addition to managing visitors without the need to call the front gate, the QuickPass online service also allows a resident to provide for automatic alerts (via text and/or e-mail) when a scheduled visitor is admitted. For those residents that already use the QuickPass online system (and for new users), we also request that you regularly review and update your approved visitor list. Failure to delete a former vendor/visitor from your list allows them to continue to enter Bellasera.

# December in the Garden

#### Our Beautiful Winter Has Arrived!

Similar to last year, November, true to form, was a beautiful month with very comfortable, pleasant weather, cool in the evening and morning, with comfortable daytime temperatures. A smooth transition into winter for you and your garden, topped off by a perfect Thanksgiving Day!

### **Enjoy Your Surroundings.... But Get Ready For Winter!**

Our community is beautiful this time of year, attributed mostly to our mag-

nificent gardens whose flowering shrubs (Bougainvillea, Lantana, Bird of Paradise, Honeysuckle and others) are in full bloom and



will continue for the next couple of months. And, with winter rain, many shrubs such as brittlebush, creosote, and ocotillos will sprout bright new leaves adding to the color and vibrancy of our surroundings.

We must assume that our great weather will be interrupted at times by cold temperatures and rain (hopefully) which is why we need to re-

view winter guidelines for your garden. We'll also provide some advice on planting, and pruning.



### Winter Guidelines: Watering & Frost

<u>Watering</u>- I covered this last month but feel it's important to reiterate and expand on guidelines for the winter. With normal winter rainfall and temperatures, reduce watering frequency and reset automatic timers along the following guidelines:

Native/Desert Adapted -Trees\* (30 to 60 days) -Shrubs (30 to 45 days)

- Ground Covers and Vines (21 to 45 days)

Non-Native - Trees (14 to 40 days)

-Shrubs, ground cover and vines (10 to 14 days)

**Plants in containers** - May not need watering as frequently as they did a month ago.

-Check before watering to be sure the top inch of the soil is dry.

**Please note** that the watering frequencies and ranges are affected by rainfall amounts. Miraculously, plants seem to know the difference between irrigation and rain. Even with steady, appropriate irrigation, fruit set and growth is always better with adequate rain.

\* Native trees are mostly drought tolerant and, once established, need no supplemental watering as our normal rainfall is sufficient. They may need a soaking once or twice during our hot season if rainfall is below normal. This is applies to most of the trees here in Bellasera.

**Note:** If you have the time and patience, I recommend turning off your drip system timers after a rainfall and manually triggering a watering cycle as necessary.

**<u>Frost</u>** - I covered frost last month but here are some additional suggestions.

If freezing temperatures are predicted, follow these guidelines:

- **1.** At sunset, drape frost cloth, burlap or old sheets and blankets (never plastic) over cold-tender plants, such as bougainvillea, citrus, hibiscus, natal plum, roses, annual flowers and vegetables.
- **2.** Extend the canopy over the entire plant or area, allowing it to hang to the ground. If possible, support the cloth on temporary framework so that it does not touch foliage. The goal is to trap heat radiating from the ground beneath the cover, warming the air around the plant.
- **3.** Remove the cover the next morning before temperatures reach 50 degrees F, or it will heat up like a greenhouse beneath the cloth.
- **4.** Cover the tips of columnar cacti with foam cups *Did You Know?*

**Bougainvillea** is very susceptible to frost and, even with protection, cannot usually be spared from damage. Also, large bougainvillea tends to be too big and unwieldy to cover, don't bother.

*Citrus Trees* also fall into the "too big" category as well and will usually suffer only a few wilted leaves. This of course does not apply to a small, newly planted citrus tree.

**Annual Flowers,** especially petunias and pansies, will do well if covered. They really thrive in this weather.

#### **Planting**

Here in the Sonoran Desert, we can always find something to plant. For December, I'd suggest the following: **Herbs, Roses and Trees.** 

<u>Herbs:</u> *Parsley, Sage, Rosemary, Thyme and Basil*- For you cooks out there, try varied alternatives of these culinary favorites.

- •Sow **parsley** seeds for 'Giant of Italy' (large, flat-leaf), 'Krausa' (triple-curled leaf with a frilly appearance) or 'Paravert' (curly leaves with a soft texture).
- •Set out transplants for golden, pineapple or tricolor **sage**; 'Arp', 'Gorizia' or 'Spice Islands' rosemary; and lemon, lime or nutmeg **thyme**.
- •Rosemary is everywhere in our community and easy to grow.
- •Basil plants are readily available in small potted plants in grocery stores. Simply transplant to a larger pot, put it in the sun, feed it water and you'll have a steady supply of fresh basil.

<u>Bare-Root Roses</u>- December is the perfect time of the year to consider purchasing bare-root roses. And, because you have a month or more to plant them, take some time to look for the best quality plants in the varieties that grow best in the valley

<u>Trees</u>- If your garden has a need, this a good time to plant or transplant deciduous trees. Deciduous trees planted on the south side of a house provide summer shade but allow sunlight through during winter when the leaves are off.

#### Pruning

I covered this last month but here are some additional guidelines for December:

- •Continue pruning *deciduous trees* such as Desert-willow, Cat-claw Acacia, and Chaste Tree.
- •Resist the urge to prune any damage on plants due to frost and do not prune cold-tender plants, wait until springtime.

•Many *agaves* are semi-dormant at this time and old, dead leaves can be removed by gently pulling from the base. Resist the urge to pull out the dead leaves that are firmly attached as this can damage the base of the agave.

December is also a good time to prune *Texas sage, roses* and other *desert and deciduous shrubs.* 

Do **not** prune frost sensitive plants such as **bougainvillea** and **hibiscus**.

#### Miscellaneous

**Citrus**- Our Gila Woodpeckers will tell you when your oranges are becoming sweet. If you notice holes in your oranges (I have) they are beginning to enjoy them.

Lemons usually lag behind oranges.

**Fertilization**- Do not fertilize this month.

Holiday Lights On Plants- If you put holiday lights on your plants and trees, take care to wrap them loosely and remember to remove them after the holiday season. Don't put "costumes" on saguaros or other columnar cacti, as this inhibits the plants ability to photosynthesize. However, lights on frost sensitive cacti and succulents can add a few degrees of protection during the cold winter months.
