#### **Board Approves Revised Parking Rules**

At the regular Board meeting on September 22, the Board unanimously approved and adopted the further revised rules regarding parking of vehicles in the Bellasera Community. Copies of the revised rules were previously mailed to each homeowner in Bellasera and was attached to an e-blast to all residents. The new Parking Rules become effective on October 23, 2022, thirty days after their approval. Copies of the final Parking Rules will be posted on the Bellasera website.

#### **Change In Security Service Vendor**

We have not been satisfied with the service and performance of our current front gate security service – Securitas. The Board has decided to terminate our existing contract with Securitas effective October 31, 2022. After interviewing several candidates, it was decided to engage Anderson Security Agency to take over those responsibilities beginning on November 1, 2022. Further details will be provided in the November newsletter.

### Free CPR Training Classes in the Clubhouse Become a lifesaver with a FREE hands-only CPR.

Most people who experience cardiac arrest at home, work or in a public location die because they do not receive immediate CPR from someone on the scene. As a bystander, don't be afraid. Your actions can only help.

We have arranged for **Lori Schmidt** from the City of Scottsdale to conduct a class on Hands-Free CPR in the Bellasera clubhouse on the following dates:

Saturday, November 5, 2022 & Saturday, January 28, 2023. Both classes began at **2 p.m.** 

Each class should last approximately ninety (90) minutes. In this class, you will learn the 3 steps to saving a life, which includes hands-only CPR and how to use an AED. As a bonus you will also be learning some basics in bleeding control. You'll get some hands-on practice on using pressure and applying a tourniquet in this quick module.

#### **Electronics Recycling**

Scottsdale residents can properly recycle electronics like computers, printers, phones, cameras, flat panel televisions/monitors and stereo equipment at the free Electronics Recycling Event on Saturday, October 8, 7:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. The event is located at 9191 E. San Salvador Drive. Proof of residency is required: a picture I.D. with your Scottsdale address or a city utility bill.

All unwanted electronics must be in the trunk or bed of your vehicle for removal. Your vehicle will not be unloaded if items are located elsewhere. Participants are required to stay in their vehicle at all times.



A limited number of vehicles will be permitted on the property during the event. Please comply with all directions from the event staff.

#### **Acceptable Items**

Computers/Peripherals: PC's, printers, keyboards, scanners, mice, flat panel monitors, circuit boards and hard drives

Office Equipment: telephones, cell phones, answering machines, pagers, typewriters and calculators

Entertainment Equipment: cameras, televisions, VCRs, DVRs, DVD players and stereo equipment

#### Items not accepted:

CRT televisions and monitors, projection screen televisions Compact Fluorescent Lights (CFL) and Fluorescent Light Bulbs Batteries

Appliances: air conditioners, can openers, coffee pots, microwaves, stoves & ovens, refrigerators, washers & dryers and hot water heaters. No commercial materials will be accepted CRT televisions and monitors (also known as tube style) and projection screen televisions are no longer accepted. Please place them out for your brush and bulk collection service.

#### **Bellasera Rules Reminders**

Exterior lighting within desert communities such as Bellasera is a sensitive issue. To achieve an appropriate balance, lighting should be adequate for residents while preserving the dramatic nighttime sky. Within the community, lighting consists primarily of landscape lighting. Street illumination occurs only at intersections or to illuminate signage. We encourage you to consult your landscape architect or a lighting designer for current lighting techniques and equipment.

Minimize lighting within residential yards. Lighting has the power of being a very strong design element, as well as an element that can provide direction. It is intended to add another level of beauty and integrity to the landscape. State of the art lighting equipment utilizes glare shields and low wattage bulbs that conceal the source of the light and eliminate glare. Emphasize downlighting as opposed to uplighting. Downlighting has less impact on the night sky as light is cast downward rather than spilling into the nighttime sky. In general, landscape lighting or low-level path lighting should serve as the primary form of exterior lighting. Avoid excessive spill lights on buildings, garage doors, driveways, etc. Allow the landscape lights to create the effect and provide indirect ambient light for visibility. ### October in the Garden

#### Fall Has Arrived!

September was certainly true to form this year as it provided its traditional bridge from the summer heat, to fall, with moderated day-time heat but cool morning and evening temperatures with a little rain thrown in. Hopefully, this is a prelude to seven or eight months of moderate, comfortable weather. *Welcome to October... The Delightful Month Of Change!* 

#### This is the Month to Dig In!

Last month, we touched on the fact that your garden had been given a head start as a result of the monsoon in providing much needed moisture and nutrients as well as making the ground soft and receptive to fall planting. It really paved the way for October, the best month of the year to plant just about everything—trees, shrubs, perennials, groundcovers, vines, ornamental grasses, cacti, succulents, wildflowers, cool-season veggies, herbs and flowers. We are truly in our prime planting month! Temperatures will abate to a comfortable level, while our soil remains sufficiently warm to promote seed germination and root growth. Seven to eight months of moderate temperatures are ahead of us, which will allow plants to establish before summer's heat returns. So forget garden maintenance chores this month and Dig In!

#### **Some Planting Suggestions For October**

<u>Citrus Trees</u>- Right now there is a wide selection of citrus available in our local nurseries; orange, grapefruit, tangerine, etc. Citrus are easy to plant as you simply have to remember to prepare a hole no deeper than the plant's root ball but at least twice the width of their containers. This promotes root growth out into the native soil. *Remember: Only dwarf citrus trees are allowed in Bellasera.* These will still provide you with plenty of fruit.

**Shrubs**- If you'd like to add some brilliant fall colors to your garden, consider the following:

**Texas Sage** - In the early development of Bellasera, Texas Sage was always included in a Landscapers list which is certainly borne out in driving around the neighborhood. It was an excellent choice as it has a lot of redeeming values. These plants are easy to care for, compact, drought-resistant, and attractive bushes A profuse bloomer, Sage attracts hummingbirds, bees, and butterflies, from late winter to early fall. Its blooms make excellent cut flowers, and it's fragrant foliage has been known to repel pests. Some suggestions:



#### Chaparral Sage • Desert Sage • Red Sage • White Sage

**Heavenly Bamboo** - An Asian plant which turns bright red to red-orange in the fall. **Firebush** - As the weather cools, leaves begin to turn a dark coppery red. They remain this color through the winter.

**Beach Vitex** - Before this deciduous shrub loses its leaves they turn a dusky purple-red.

*Crape Myrtle* - Coloring is variable, but most plants turn a reddish hue before they lose their leaves.

**Mexican Jumping Bean** - This hot weather loving shrub leaves turn a fiery red in late winter.



If you have summer annual flower beds (most likely in pots), it's time (probably later in the month) to pull them out and replace them with cool season annuals. Some suggestions: •Alyssum: A low growing border plant in white, pink or purple. Full sun to light partial shade.



- •**Begonia**: Gives masses of color in *shady spots*, red, pink or white in dark leafed varieties, or a mixture of colors in green leafed types.
- •Calendula: Yellow or orange flowers with dark centers, makes excellent cut flowers. Needs sun.
- *Chrysanthemum paludosum*: Miniature daisy flowers cover this low growing annual in a cloud of white. *Use for sunny borders.*
- *Dianthus*: An array of reds, pinks, violets and white adorn these specially selected Sweet Williams. *Sun or partial shade*.
- Geranium: Available in a rainbow of colors. Full sun to partial shade.
- Pansy and Viola: The most popular flower for fall and winter, these hardy free blooming plants are available in a wide variety of colors to suit any décor. Pick a sunny spot for best results. Violas will take light shade.
- Petunia: Reds, pinks, whites, burgundy and blues. Full sun.
- **Poppies and Primroses**: These favorites will be ready for you when the weather starts to turn cold. Iceland poppies for bright *sunny spots* and traditional primrose for *shady areas*.
- •Snapdragons: Taller mid-sized varieties are great for cut flowers or colorful backgrounds. Dwarf types make fantastic borders. Either way, you can't go wrong with their rainbow of colors for sunny spots.



•Copper-leaved Caesalpinia: The small leaves turn from a deep burnished red to a bright golden red through the winter.

#### **Miscellaneous Tasks**

**Citrus**- Late summer application of nitrogen fertilizer will help fruit sizing. This is more significant for fall ripening (navel oranges and tangerines) than spring-ripening (grapefruit and Valencia oranges). **Prune Paramiels** Cut back spring flowering paramiels like brittlebuch, globe mallow ruelling and

**Prune Perennials**- Cut back spring-flowering perennials like *brittlebush*, *globe mallow*, *ruellia*, and groundcovers like *sundrops*, and *trailing bush* hard this month. If the plant is especially leggy or unruly, prune to remove at least 1/3 of the plant or more. After pruning, water well.

**Deciduous Fruit Trees**- Prune the water sprouts.

**Landscape Plants**- Cut off spent blooms to stimulate rebloom.

**Weed Control**- Pre-emergent herbicides can be applied from October through early December for winter weed control. Follow the package directions carefully for best results. Do not use pre-emergent herbicides where you will be planting seeds this season.

**Mesquite Trees**- If your Mesquite trees are looking tall and scraggly, take action now to do some corrective pruning.

Roses- Resume full fertilizing of established roses as the weather cools.

**Fertilize**- If you did not fertilize established cold-hardy shrubs last month, do so early this month. This is the final fertilization of the year.

#### Watering

Yes, it is finally time to cut back on your watering. Reduce watering frequencies as plant needs decrease with shortening, cooling days. Once the temperatures begin dipping below 100° gradually start cutting back water to all plants to begin hardening them off for the winter. Remember, both frequency and duration need to be adjusted gradually. Do not stop cold turkey. Change your irrigation timer to reflect the changes in temperature.
