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

#### **Annual Meeting Packages Sent Out**

Each homeowner was sent a mailing with the notice of the Annual Homeowner's Meeting on **Sunday, April 16**, at **2:00 p.m.** on the clubhouse patio. A Candidate Application Form was included for residents who wish to apply for open Board of Directors positions. Applications to run as a candidate for an open Board seat must be received by **5:00 p.m.** on **Monday, March 13** for those wishing to appear on the ballot. This year there will be two (2) open positions on the Board of Directors, each for two-year terms.

# Homeowners File Suit Against Bellasera to Rescind New Parking Rules

In September of last year, after consulting with our outside legal counsel and considering the comments and input from homeowners and residents voiced at several meetings, the Board of Directors voted to adopt new rules for overnight parking and vendor/construction parking in Bellasera. Copies of the new parking rules were mailed to each homeowner and became effective on October 22, 2022.

At the time of the adoption of the new parking rules, the Board also provided that homeowners/residents could apply for an exception to the new parking rules. The Board would then consider the request, based upon the facts and circumstances in each individual case. Since the adoption of the new parking rules, the Board has considered and granted exceptions to two homeowners.

On February 14, 2023, homeowners **Richard** and **Darlene Rudner** filed suit against Bellasera in the Maricopa Superior Court asking the Court to declare the new parking rules invalid. Prior to their filing of this lawsuit, we encouraged the **Rudners** to apply for an exception, but they have declined to do so.

We have tendered this matter to the community's current liability insurance carrier who will assume the defense of this action going forward.

#### **Bellasera Rules Reminders**

The affairs of the Association shall be managed by a Board of Directors which shall serve as the corporate policy-making body for the Association. The number of directors in the Association shall be not less than three nor more than seven. Nominations for election to the Board shall be made in accordance with policies and procedures established, from time to time, by the Board. Such policies and procedures may include, but are not limited to, requiring a specified number of signatures as a precondition to appearing on the ballot or permitting nominations through a Nominating Committee. The Board shall establish policies and procedures for nominations no later than 90 days prior to any election. Except with respect to "write-in candidates" or nominations made from the floor at any meeting (if permitted by the policies and procedures), nominations shall be made no later than 45 days before the election shall be held.

Except as provided in this Section 3.4, annual elections for directors shall be held prior to the end of April. Directors elected at such annual elections shall take office immediately and complete the training requirements as soon as practicable pursuant to Section 3.1. Except as otherwise specifically provided in these Bylaws, each director shall serve two-year terms. The terms will be staggered as determined by the Board of Directors; provided, directors shall hold office until their respective successors are elected (or appointed as the case may be) and take office. Directors may be elected by the Homeowners to serve up to three consecutive terms. Notwithstanding the above or any other provision of these Bylaws, each Homeowner shall be entitled to cast one vote with respect to each vacancy to be filled. There shall be no cumulative voting. The candidate(s) receiving the most votes for each vacancy to be filled shall be elected.

# March In the Garden

#### Winter Hangs Around

For the first time in four years, winter did not loosen its grip as our chilly winter weather continued through February as below normal temperatures and an abundance of rain (we received over 5 inches in the last three months) were the norm. However, unlike 2019, Bellasera was not covered in snow, nor did we have to endure a serious frost.

#### As We Move Into March....Think Positive!

As we enter into the month with the cold weather still at our heels, it is understandable if little attention is being paid to gardening or mainte-

nance of our yards. However, be assured that winter will eventually lose its grip during March with the first whisper of spring. In the meantime, there are a number of important tasks you need to address starting with a *General Assessment* of your garden with two major things in mind: *Maintenance & Planting*.

#### **Assess Your Garden**

If you haven't done so yet, take a walk around your property and reacquaint yourself with your surroundings. Some things to pay attention to are as follows:

**Frost Damage** - We've had very little measurable frost this past winter and it appears we will emerge almost "frost free". You'll notice our frost sensitive landscape plants, such as **lantana**, are mostly intact and our flowering perennials such as **bougainvillea**, and **honeysuckle** continue to sparkle while our early bloomers such the **senna** and **penstemon** are lagging behind due to the cold weather. As we get rid of this cold air and warm up, your garden will really come alive.

Citrus should be starting to bud out along new leaf sprouts.

**Mesquite Trees** - We have a variety of mesquite here in Bellasera and they are quickly losing their leaves at various rates depending on species and exposure. You will find new leaf growth already on some, especially velvet mesquite.

**Planting Needs** - Even though most of our gardens here in Bellasera are mature, identify plants that should be replaced. This could be because they have died or are just not doing well due to wrong exposure, improper drainage or heat stress

#### Pruning

#### **Shrubs, Groundcovers and Vines**

March is the perfect time to prune these. Specifically, you should pay attention to: **Summer and fall flowering shrubs including:** • *Texas Sages* • *Yellow Bells* • *Lantana* • *Turpentine Bush* • *Black Dalea* • *Mexican-honeysuckle* • *Sky Flower* 

Warm-season herbaceous (that have no persistent woody stem above ground) perennials, groundcovers and vines including: • Chocolate Flower • Plumbago

- Mexican Hat Gaura Queen's Wreath Mealy-cup Sage Rock Verbena
- Trailing Lantana Dyssodia Passion Vines Yellow Orchid-vine

Prune by cutting back to emerging growth or to the basal rosette (group of leaves arranged from a central point).

Continue to deadhead annuals and herbaceous perennials to encourage continued flowering including *Desert Marigold, Red Sage, Angelita-Daisy* and *Gaillardia.* 

<u>Cactus</u> Wait to prune your *prickly-pears* and *chollas* until after flowering. Spent stalks of *aloes, agaves* and other succulents can be removed at this time.

#### Miscellaneous

<u>Fertilization</u> - Now is the time to fertilize your warm-season cacti, succulents, herbaceous and woody perennials, and annuals in containers. Periodic fertilization may be needed for plants in containers as nutrients will have diminished in the soil over time. Depending on the type of fertilizer used, follow directions on the label.

<u>Roses</u> - Continue feeding roses every six weeks to prepare them for spring's peak bloom. Spread fresh mulch to maintain consistent soil moisture, making sure mulch does not touch their stems

<u>Citrus</u> - Do not prune citrus except to remove dead or damaged wood and branches obstructing pathways, views, or structures.

**Rosemary** - They are in a growth spurt and starting to bloom. Do not prune until they are finished blooming.

<u>Drip System</u> - As temperatures rise during the month of March, turn on your irrigation timer, test the timer to see if it is working properly and replace back-up batteries if necessary. Check for leaks and clogged emitters and flush out the poly lines.

#### Planting...Delay, But Not Too Long

March is normally a terrific month for adding most plant types to our low-desert landscapes as warming soil temperatures will enhance seed germination and root development before the arrival of summer's intense heat. You may want to delay your planting slightly as we await our warm weather remembering that you can plant into April. However, don't wait longer than necessary as our winter rains have left our soil very moist and full of nutrients.

It's the ideal time to enhance your landscape (Trees, shrubs, groundcovers, vines, perennials, cacti and other succulents etc.) and fill your requirements for vegetables, herbs and flowers.

Local nurseries should be well stocked with fresh offerings for the spring planting season to satisfy your needs. Choose plants based on their mature height and width, matching their size to the space available in your landscape. This advance planning eliminates unnecessary pruning

#### Some Planting Suggestions

#### Warm-season shrubs:

- Yellow Bells Desert Cotton Sennas Velvet-pod Mimosa Texas Sage
- Fire Bush Ruellia Mexican Bush Sage Sky Flower Bird of Paradise species

#### Warm-season herbaceous perennials:

- Datura Desert Four O'Clocks Plumbago
- Wine Cups Arizona Foldwing Gaura Hummingbird Trumpet

#### Vines:

- Queen's Wreath Arizona Canyon Grape Black Dalea
- Yucca Passion Flowers Slender Janusia

**Herbs:** How about an herb garden to perk up your cooking? Herbs do very well here. Transplant *basil, bay, chamomile, chives, epazote, feverfew, lavender, lemon balm, lemon grass, lemon verbena, oregano, rosemary, sage and santolina.*
