

#### POSSIBLE CHANGES COMING TO LAWN AREAS AT CLUBHOUSE

If you reside here year-round, or even if you are one of our 'Snowbirds', you are aware of the ever-present drought conditions that Arizona and the Southwest have been experiencing the last several years. Water in our area is a critical but an increasingly diminishing resource. In order to secure and maximize longterm sustainable water supplies, many cities in the Southwest have adopted various measures and responses - some voluntary and some mandated. The City of Scottsdale has been proactive in planning for long-term sustainable water supplies for its customers. Today, there are no mandatory water use restrictions in place in Scottsdale. At this time, the City asks all residents to voluntarily cut their water usage by at least five percent. Approximately 65% of the City's total water demand is from residential customers, and turf irrigation is a significant portion of total demand. The City is currently promoting a voluntary water conservation program designed to reduce water usage by replacing water-thirsty lawns with vegetation appropriate to our Sonoran Desert. Aside from the reduction in water bills, the City offers rebates and other enticements to participate. If current conditions persist, it is only a matter of time until some form of mandates are adopted.

With this in mind, the Building and Grounds Committee is exploring the phased removal of the current turf areas adjacent to the Clubhouse and replacing them with native plants and substitute ground covers. Additional recreational/social amenities may also be considered. Any such project would be undertaken in phases over the next several years and would be designed to take maximum advantage of all available rebates and incentives offered by the City. The Board has supported these efforts although no final approval to move forward as to any particular plan has been given.

Prior to the Board making any final decisions, the Building & Grounds Committee will be hosting two (2) community-wide meetings – one in November and a second next January – to present their proposed plan to the Community and to answer questions and solicit homeowners' input. We will announce the specific dates and times of such meetings in subsequent postings.



# September in the Garden

# A One Two Punch: Record-Breaking High Temperatures & AWOL Monsoon

In addition to suffering through an extended record breaking heat, our monsoon was a no show. This lack of rainfall not only added stress to your plants and trees but deprived your garden of much needed moisture and nutrients necessary for ideal fall planting.

#### Heat Stress...Understand and Recognize It

Consistent weeks of record-breaking high

temperatures are stressful for many plants. Despite best efforts to keep plants alive, many will begin to see symptoms of heat and drought stress. Leaves, fruit, flowers, bark, wood and roots may be damaged. Different plant species have a specific threshold when a critical temperature is reached or exceeded, they will experience tissue damage, dehydration and death.

If you take a walk in your garden, you will likely notice some plants are yellowing, wilting, or have given up and died. The yellowing in succulents is normal in response to summer heat, but you may notice some are suffering

more severe than normal and, conversely, others doing better. Why the difference? Filtered sun, perhaps from a tree, and age as older plants tend to handle heat stress better.

You'll also notice that some plants will always do well in heat. These include **Lantana, Texas Sage** and **Bougainvillea** which are all widespread here in Bellasera.



#### **Heat Stress...How To Deal With It**

With hot days remaining into September and, assuming that the monsoon doesn't rescue us, how do we proceed?

- 1. Be sure plants are receiving enough water. You need to increase the frequency when temps are above 110 degrees.
- 2. Don't fertilize. Feeding plants simply makes them work harder to produce new growth when all they are trying to do is deal with the heat.
- 3. Don't prune away heat-damaged growth until the weather is more normal. Those ugly leaves are protecting the interior of the plant.

One final note: Think about adding more of the plants that have coped with our stressful heat, perhaps as replacements for those that you have lost.

#### As We Transition To Fall, Some Events Are Certain!

Even though it may difficult to get into a fall mindset, keep in mind that some things are certain, which are not only a precursor to fall, but have a *positive affect on your garden*. Specifically:

- The sun shifts from a northern to southern arc: but it's more dramatic or apparent for us. Why? Well, most of our homes are oriented north/south and 85% of our days are sunny. We are aware of the sun. Observe your plants that have a southern exposure, they will perk up.
- Shorter days and cooler nighttime temperatures. Morning temperatures should start becoming bearable and evenings, pleasant.





• Some Plants will begin to come alive, especially Lantana and Pink Fairy Duster. I encourage you to take a few minutes out of your day, walk around our garden and observe the changes. **Have Positive Garden Thoughts!** 

#### **Fall Planting - General Guidelines**

**Timing:** Based on our somewhat poor monsoon season and slow cool down, the optimum time to start planting is probably toward the *end of September*. You should wait until the night temperature falls in the 70's as it will be less stressful for root systems to establish and plants don't need as much water to survive. However, if you start planting in mid-September, you should still monitor plants for signs of water stress.

**Evaluate Your Garden:** As I mentioned in the above section on heat stress, after a long, hot summer, take a look at your landscape to decide what works and what doesn't. What do you need to replace? What do you need to add?

#### What to Plant

**Desert-Adapted Landscape Plants** - Trees, shrubs, vines, groundcovers, perennials, cacti and succulents can all be planted this month, after Sept. 15 (with the caveat regarding nighttime temperature). Early fall planting allows roots to become established in warm soils before cold nighttime temperatures set in. Just be aware of their potential mature height and width, allowing room to grow without interference or unnecessary pruning to keep them in bounds

Vegetables - Yes, you can grow vegetables here in Bellasera. If you have the inclination, energy and time, try these: •Carrots •Beets •Green Onions •Radishes •Garlic • Lettuce (head)
•Endive Lettuce (leaf) •Cabbage •Cauliflower • Broccoli

#### **Warm Season Annual Flower Beds**

While you can consider replacing them with cool season annuals, I would wait until October as they should continue to do fine. I'll have recommendations next month.

#### **Miscellaneous Tasks For September**

**Fertilization** - Ordinarily, this is an ideal month for that last application of fertilizer (low nitrogen formula) before cold weather arrives. However, as with planting, you should wait until the night temperature falls in the 70's before any application of fertilizer.

**Freshen Up Roses** - Prepare rosebushes for their second bloom cycle. Just as new growth begins to appear, remove any dead or damaged canes. Lightly trim weak top growth. Do not remove more than one-third of the total bush. Feed with a slow-release fertilizer to last through fall.

**Watering** - Keep an eye on the temperatures and be prepared to adjust your watering schedules. If it is one of those years where it is still above 100° and the nights are still hot, hold off on the water cutbacks until early October. Those plants that are just waking up after the hot summer will want water.

**Citrus** - If you did not do so in August, fertilize with one-third of the tree's annual nitrogen requirement. **Mesquite Trees** - It's a great time to prune them because they had their spring and summer growth and will now hold their prune for more of the calendar year.

Monitor Agaves - Check your agaves and, if any have collapsed into a rotted mess, they were infested by agave snout weevils earlier in the year. Although it is too late to save them, you can control the weevils' spread to nearby agaves by digging up and disposing of the rotten plant material and surrounding soil; this will remove any eggs or larvae.

**Weeds** - We probably won't have many weeds, but pull any that might have sprouted.
