



The 2.24 inches of rain on July 30 was the heaviest one-day total since the "big one" on July 31, 2007 when over 3.30 inches of rain fell here. During this storm the wash overflowed the bridge across Balao Drive, just east of the intersection with Brisa Drive, making the road impassable for several hours.

This year the 24 mph sustained wind velocity during the July 30 storm was the highest ever recorded on the Bellasera weather station.

### **Bellasera Rules Reminders**

Activity room and kitchen (Scheduled time of the event only): Fee: \$500.00, plus a \$300.00 refundable security deposit to pay for the cost of any damage to the facility as determined in the sole discretion of the Association's Community Manager.

### **Help Scottsdale Save Money**

I recently met with **John Stumbaugh**, Scottsdale Solid Waste Program Senior Representative, regarding what residents can do to save Scottsdale money by not putting items that can be recycled into the garbage cans or leaving them on the curb for bulk trash pickup.

John pointed out that it costs the city of Scottsdale money to dump trash in the landfill, but the city receives revenue from its contracted recycler for all of the city's recycling material. Scottsdale saves money by not dumping recyclables into the landfill, but actually makes money from separating the recycling items.

All of us can cooperate and save Scottsdale money (and our tax dollars) by putting cardboard and all recyclables into the mauve cans and not in the black garbage cans. Do not put recyclables by the curb for pickup by the bulk trash truck, since that truck brings things to the dump, not the recycling contractor.

If items are too large for your recycle can, please consider cutting them down so they fit into the container.



### The Monsoon Has Awakened

### **Our Desert And Brought Life To Your Garden**

For the second year in a row, our monsoon has exceeded expectations giving us a welcome break from the summer doldrums as well as rejuvenating our entire landscape. If you take a walk around your garden, you'll find most of your plants flush with growth and needing attention. Just take a look at your trees, they are greener and bigger! More importantly, the monsoon will have a huge, positive impact on

our fall planting and provide......



### A Smooth Transition Into Fall Planting

Normally, September slowly ushers in fall with cooling nighttime temperatures to help your plants recover from the heat of the summer. However, this year, your garden has been given a head start as the monsoon has not only provided cooler temperatures but much needed moisture and nutrients for your plants and trees to shake off any effects of our summer heat. And, just as important, the ground

will be soft and receptive to fall planting.

### **Fall Planting - General Guidelines**

**Evaluate Your Garden:** After a long, hot summer, take a look at your landscape to decide what works and what doesn't. What do you need to replace? What do you need to add?

**Site Selection:** This is the key to growing non-native plants here in the Sonoran desert. The sun will be getting farther and farther south each day. A site on the North side of a wall with half-day light now will be in more shade later. Plants need at least six to eight hours of sun to perform properly.

**Timing:** Planting is not as hard on the plants if you wait until the night temperature falls in the 70's to do your plantings as it will be less stressful for root systems to establish and plants don't need as much water to survive. October is considered prime planting time for us in the low-desert. However, if you start planting in mid-September, you should still monitor plants for signs of water stress.

**Note:** Most all of our landscaping in Bellasera was initially put in by landscapers 20 plus years ago and I'm sure everything was not planted in an optimal spot. So, if that's the case, I encourage you to move it! Also, plants do have a lifespan.

### What to Plant

**Desert-Adapted Landscape Plants-** *Trees, shrubs, vines, groundcovers, perennials, cacti and succulents* can all be planted this month, after Sept. 15. Early fall planting allows roots to become established in warm soils before cold nighttime temperatures set in. Just be aware of their potential mature height and width, allowing room to grow without interference or unnecessary pruning to keep them in bounds.

**Vegetables**-Yes, you can grow vegetables here in Bellasera. If you have the inclination, energy and time, try these: ●Carrots ●Beets ●Green Onions ●Radishes ●Garlic ● Lettuce (head)

### **Pruning**

As mentioned above, the monsoon has resulted in substantial growth in your garden, especially trees and shrubs which are going to require pruning. Consider the following:

Trees- There are traditional schedules for pruning native trees, e.g. - Summer is the best time to prune fast-growing, drought-tolerant trees, both native and imports, including Palo Verde, Mesquite, Willow Acacia, and Palo brae. The winter is an excellent time to prune deciduous trees because they lose their leaves and it is easier to see the branch structure when making the cuts. However, it is safe to prune all of your trees in the fall, so prune where necessary.

**Shrubs** – For September only, I would simply recommend that you assess all of your shrubs and prune where necessary to control plant size (they may have substantial overgrowth) and remove any dead branches or overcrowding stems.

### **Miscellaneous Tasks For September**

**Fertilization**-This is the month for that last application of fertilizer before cold weather arrives. Use a low nitrogen formula so as to prevent excessive new growth. Plants need a chance to harden off to prepare for the cold as new growth will likely freeze with the onset of a frost.

**Freshen Up Roses**- Prepare rosebushes for their second bloom cycle. Just as new growth begins to appear, remove any dead or damaged canes. Lightly trim weak top growth. Remove suckers that arise from below the bud union (a raised bump where the variety and rootstock are grafted) because they waste the plant's energy and will not produce desired blooms. Do not remove more than one-third of the total bush. Feed with a slow-release fertilizer to last through fall.

**Weed**s- Unfortunately, our monsoon will cause weeds to sprout which will compete with garden plants for moisture, nutrients, and sunlight. So, please pull them.

**Watering**- Keep an eye on the temperatures and be prepared to adjust your watering schedules. If it is one of those years where it is still above 100° and the nights are still hot, hold off on the water cutbacks until early October.

**Citrus**- If you did not do so in August, fertilize with one-third of the tree's annual nitrogen requirement. **Mesquites Trees**- If they survived the monsoon, it's a great time to prune them because they had their spring and summer growth and will now hold their prune for more of the calendar year.

**Monitor Agaves**- Check your agaves and, if any have collapsed into a rotted mess, they were infested by agave snout weevils earlier in the year. Although it is too late to save them, you can control the weevils' spread to nearby agaves by digging up and disposing of the rotten plant material and surrounding soil; this will remove any eggs or larvae. Adults are dusty black weevils about one inch long, with a long snout. They do not have wings. Larvae are similar to white grubs without legs.

### **Warm Season Annual Flower Beds**

While you can consider replacing them with cool season annuals, I would wait until October as your summer flowers have probably been revitalized by the monsoon. I'll have recommendations next month.
